## CWL Energy Limited ELECTRICITY ACT 1989 TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (SCOTLAND) ACT 1997 THE ELECTRICITY WORKS (ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT) (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2017

Notice is hereby given that CWL Energy Limited, company registration number SC576901, with its Registered Office at Caledonian Exchange, 19a Canning Street, Edinburgh, EH3 8HE, has submitted Additional Information to the Scottish Ministers in relation to the application for consent under Section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 to construct and operate a wind farm known as Scoop Hill Community Wind Farm, 5km south east of Molfat and 11km north east of Lockerbie, and is located in Dumfries and Galloway (Central Grid Reference 315500 598500). The installed capacity of the proposed generating station would be over 50 MW, and would comprise of up to 60 turbines with a maximum ground to blade tip height of 250m. The proposed development will also include a battery storage facility with a capacity of 200MW. The proposal is subject to Environmental Impact Assessment. An EIA Report has been produced to accompany the application for consent.

The application also requests that a direction be made by the Scottish Ministers under section 57 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997.

CWL Energy Limited has now submitted Additional Information to the Scottish Ministers, which includes information relating to the removal of seventeen wind turbines and associated infrastructure, the addition of 2 new turbines and associated infrastructure, the reduction in tip height of four turbines, the removal of two borrow pits, the removal of one temporary construction compound and the relocation of three borrow pits. The Additional Information also contains information relating to the removal of three satellite battery storage facilities. There will be one main storage facility located adjacent to the main substation with a capacity of 200 MW. The Additional Information will contain information in relation to planning policy, design evolution, landscape and visual matters, aviation lighting, traffic and transport, cultural heritage, noise, community benefits, forestry, ecology, ornithology and hydrology, geology and hydrogeology.
